- Categories of Submissions:
 - Photography (traditional and digital)
 - Graphic Design
 - Book Art.
 - Painting/Drawing/Printmaking
 - Sculpture (carving (subtractive)); additive; synthetic and natural media. found/recycled media)
 - Mosaics, stained glass, ceramics
 - NO work that derives from kits or submissions from last year.
- 2. Emphasis is on originality and personal interpretation.

Please NO copies of works of art.

- 3. Submissions must have a label taped to the work. Labels need to be printed and provided for submissions. Label information is the following:
 - a. Artist's name
 - b. Title of Work
 - Dimensions (I" x h" x w") Medium (s) of Work c.
 - d. Year of Execution
- 4. Requirements for submissions:
 - (Photography) minimum 8" x 10". Work must be prepared with appropriate and functional hanging/installation hardware. Frames suggested but not required.
 - · (Paintings) Frames are not required for paintings but paintings must be appropriately wired on the back for hanging.
 - (Drawings, designs and prints other than photographic prints) minimum 15" x 15." Work must be prepared with appropriate and functional hanging/ installation hardware. Frames suggested but not required.
- 5. An individual can submit up to five works. These can vary in media or can be the same medium.
- 6. Works not prepared for installation will not be included in the exhibit.

For Reflection and Discussion

Week of January 21, 2024

"The Peacemaker: Moving Past Anger and Conflict"

Matthew 5:21-26

Read Matthew 5:21-26

1. As Jesus says this, He is calling His disciples to think of personal holiness and not just public holiness. Thus, in verses 21-22, he moves past the public sin of murder to the more private, personal, and interpersonal sin of anger.

What is the problem with anger? Why do you think Jesus treats it as such a big issue?

- 2. The Bible shows that murder is the destruction of the image of God (see Genesis 9:6). How is anger similar to this?
- 3. In verse 22, Jesus speaks about the forms that sinful anger expresses itself the feelings of anger, insulting the person, and even public humiliation or slander.

Think about some of the ways that we might express anger: rage, bitterness, resentment, vengeance, withdrawal, cursing, belittling, slandering, insulting, humiliating. Can you think of others?

How do these expressions affect relationships?

How have you seen these expressions damage relationships?

How does your anger express itself? Do you have a default method?

How can you better deal with your anger?

Make this a matter of prayer.

4. Ephesians 4:26 says "Be angry and do not sin; do not let the sun go down on your anger". We may experience anger, as "the emotional reaction to a perceived evil".

How can we experience anger and yet not sin?

Have you ever had anger that backfired on you?

Have you ever been able to work out your anger in a way that was positive and redemptive?

5. In Matthew 5:23-26, Jesus describes *reconciliation*. It follows immediately after his discussion on anger because our sinful expressions of anger can cause offense and we may need to reconcile with others.

How would you describe the pattern of reconciliation in the passage? What does Jesus want from us?

Notice the focus that Jesus puts on reconciling with those we have sinned against. He leads us to focus more on our sins than the sins of others against us. Why do you think this is so important?

- 6. Is there someone you need to apologize to? Will you commit it to prayer? Are you willing to apologize for your contribution without any excuse or shifting blame? Can you get help from the church in this?
- 7. This is a deeply personal passage for us to work through. Ask God how to respond to this passage in your own life. Can you think of any steps you can take to apply it this week?
