



For Reflection and Discussion

Week of March 17, 2024

"Every Sinner: A Candidate for Grace"
Acts 16:11-24

- 1. Look at verses 11-15. What are we told about Lydia? How did she come to faith? What signs are we given that Lydia was truly converted?
- 2. Lydia was a key person for starting the church in Philippi. Lydia showed hospitality to Paul and his companions. Have you ever been able to use hospitality to help start a new church, to help a missionary, or to help a church grow? What is the place of hospitality?
- 3. Look at verses 16-19. What are we told about the slave girl? How did people view the girl?
- 4. Describe the response to this healing in verses 20-24. Why were the people so upset? How does this show the evil that is in the world. Have you ever done anything as a Christian that angered unbelievers? What kinds of things might upset modern people?
- 5. What differences do you see between the pre-Christian spiritual state of the slave-girl with the pre-Christian spiritual state of Lydia?
- 6. What differences do you see between the ministry of Paul to Lydia and his ministry to the slave-girl?
- 7. What do you think Luke is trying to show us with these two salvation stories? Does it teach us anything about evangelism?

- 8. Notice the miracle that took place in the life of Lydia stated in verse 14. The slave girl also required a miracle before she could hear from Jesus (verse 18). What do both of these show us about the sovereignty of God in salvation? How does this remind us that no one is out of the reach of God's grace?
- 9. It is likely that there were other conversions in Philippi. Why do you think Luke chose these two (with the Philippian jailer, starting in verse 23) to profile in this historical account?
- 10. What can you apply from this lesson? Who are some difficult to reach people that you should pray for?
