

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

"For the Word of God is living and powerful, and sharper than any two-edged sword, piercing even to the division of soul and spirit, and of joints and marrow, and is a discerner of the thoughts and intents of the heart" (Hebrews 4:12).

Every human person reflects upon their life and their future decisions by talking to themselves in their own mind. We consider this self talk as meditation. Yet if we only listen to our own opinion and interpret life by our own purposes without any other reflection we are subject to self delusion.

The Bible as the Word of God is designed to interrupt our self talk and meditation to consider God's instruction and guidance. As Hebrews 4:12 says, the Word of God enables us to discern our own thoughts and motivations.

Often we do not know why we do the things that we do. But God knows and He gives us words to describe our thoughts and motivations when we could not find the right words.

The Word of God interrupts our thoughts and enables us to listen to God and to communicate back to Him. Christian meditation is a conversation with God. We may often think of it as prayer.

We see how the Psalmist in Psalm 119 is continually talking to God as the words "You"

and Your" are the most frequently used words. "Your Word have I hid in my heart that I might not sin against You" (Psalm 119:11).

The Psalms then are the temple in which we draw near to God. David spoke of dwelling in the house of the Lord all the days of his life, to behold the beauty of the Lord and to inquire in His temple (Psalm 27:4). What is striking about this desire is that the temple was not yet built as David's son, Solomon, was to build the temple after him.

Then the temple is God's spiritual presence where we are able to meditate on God's Word and know His personal presence to commune with us.

Again in Psalm 18:6 David says, "In my distress I called You the Lord, and cried out to my God; He heard my voice from His temple, and my cry came before Him even to His ears."

Meditation is worship as we reflect upon our lives in the Lord's presence. "We have thought, O God, on Your lovingkindness, in the midst of Your temple" (Psalm 48:9).

I pray that our Lord would deepen our meditations as we prepare to reflect upon the Psalms this summer.

"Worthy is the Lamb who was slain To receive power and riches and wisdom,

And strength and honor and glory and blessing!"

And every creature which is in heaven and on the earth and under the earth and such as are in the sea, and all that are in them, I heard saying:

Be to Him who sits on the throne, And to the Lamb, forever and ever!" -Revelation 5:12-13

Worship should be our delight. If our aim in worship is our satisfaction we will fall into the trap of looking for what we enjoy, to be entertained, and neither God nor we will be satisfied. If our aim is God's satisfaction we will both be satisfied. Men are satisfied with too little. Anything other than God cannot satisfy.

Worship is reorienting ourselves to our real purpose - to set our affections on God rather than idols. You are never more human than when you worship.

Good worship engages the mind, heart and will. The mind must be engaged with truth to dislodge idolatries and realign the mind. But if only the mind is engaged worship becomes intellectual exercise. The heart must be engaged, but heart only becomes sentimentalism confuses the unbeliever. The will is changed when the mind is enlightened with truth and the heart warmed. Then the will will let go an idol.



Truth Treasures

from the New Life in Christ Church Library

April 2018

Truth Treasures highlights Biblical truths hidden within the pages of books by some of America's most beloved authors of the Reformed Faith. In most cases, the selected highlight will be from a book available in the New Life in Christ Church Library, located at the end of the north wing of the church. -Robert W.



For the first half of this new year, the monthly *Truth Treasures* articles will follow one theme from a set of articles by R.C. Sproul covering TULIP and Reformed Theology. This month we will cover the introduction and the following five months we will examine each of the five letters in T-U-L-I-P.

TULIP and Reformed Theology: Limited Atonement

from R.C. Sproul, April 8, 2017

I think that of all the five points of Calvinism, limited atonement is the most controversial, and the one that engenders perhaps the most confusion and consternation. This doctrine is chiefly concerned about the original purpose, plan, or design of God in sending Christ into the world to die on the cross. Was it the Father's intent to send His Son to die on the cross to make salvation possible for everyone, but with the possibility that His death would be effective for no one? That is, did God simply send Christ to the cross to make salvation possible, or did God, from all eternity, have a plan of salvation by which, according to the riches of His grace and His eternal election, He designed the atonement to ensure the salvation of His people? Was the atonement limited in its original design?

I prefer not to use the term *limited atonement* because it is misleading. I rather speak of *definite redemption* or *definite atonement*, which communicates that God the Father designed the work of redemption specifically with a view to providing salvation for the elect, and that Christ died for His sheep and laid down His life for those the Father had given to Him.

One of the texts that we often hear used as an objection against the idea of a definite atonement is 2 Peter 3:8–9: "But do not overlook this one fact, beloved, that with the Lord one day is as a thousand years, and a thousand years as one day. The Lord is not slow to fulfill his promise as some count slowness, but is patient toward you, not wishing that any should perish, but that all should reach repentance." The immediate antecedent of the word any in this passage is the word us, and I think it's perfectly clear that Peter is saying that God is not willing that any of us should perish, but that all of us should come to salvation. He's not speaking of all mankind indiscriminately; the us is a reference to the believing people to whom Peter is speaking. I don't think we want to believe in a God who sends Christ to die on the cross and then crosses His fingers, hoping that someone will take advantage of that atoning death. Our view of God is different. Our view is that the redemption of specific sinners was an eternal plan of God, and this plan and design was perfectly conceived and perfectly executed so that the will of God to save His people is accomplished by the atoning work of Christ.

This does not mean that a limit is placed on the value or the merit of the atonement of Jesus Christ. It's traditional to say that the atoning work of Christ is sufficient for all. That is, its meritorious value is sufficient to cover the sins of all people, and certainly anyone who puts his or her trust in Jesus Christ will receive the full measure of the benefits of that atonement. It is also important to understand that the gospel is to be preached universally. This is another controversial point, because on the one hand the gospel is offered universally to all who are within earshot of the preaching of it, but it's not universally offered in the sense that it's offered to anyone without any conditions. It's offered to anyone who believes. It's offered to anyone who repents. Obviously the merit of the atonement of Christ is given to all who believe and to all who repent of their sins.
