“Under the Shadow of the Almighty”*Psalm 91*

In January 1956, five young married couples sang a hymn based on this Psalm.

“We rest on Thee, our Shield and our Defender; We go not forth alone against the foe; Strong in Thy strength, safe in Thy keeping tender. We rest on Thee, and in Thy Name we go . . . We go in faith, our own great weakness feeling . . . We rest on Thee, and in Thy Name we go.”

Each of the five husbands boarded a jungle plane to reach the people known then as Auca Indians. They entered the jungle under the shadow of the Almighty as their refuge. They never left that jungle as they were speared to death. LIFE magazine printed pictures of the bodies floating in the river and the five widows four holding a baby singing this same hymn.

“We rest on Thee our Shield and Defender! Thine is the battle. Thine shall be the praise; when passing through gates of pearly splendor, victors we rest with Thee, through endless days.”

I. Quiet Rest – *Psalm 91:1-4*

A. The secret place

1. In His presence – *Psalm 31:19-20*
2. We are hidden in the rock of Christ Jesus – *Psalm 27:5*
3. In Christ we are preserved and delivered from trouble – *Psalm 32:7*

B. We may commune with God in a quiet place or in the midst of the noise and confusion of life

1. Such rest requires intentional faith – *Psalm 16:8; 17:8-9*
2. God Himself is our refuge and home – *Psalm 90:1; 46:1-4*

II. Protection – *Psalm 91:5-13*

A. The believers are in heaven's special care

1. No fear of the night – *Psalm 91:5*
2. No fear of accidents

B. No fear of disease – *Psalm 91:6*

1. Do we need to be obsessed with sanitizing our hands?
2. A clear conscience is our greatest protection from disease – *Psalm 32:1-5; 1 Corinthians 11:28-31*

C. Our Father gives courage – *Psalm 91:7-8*

1. No evil shall befall your home – *Psalm 91:9-10*
2. Angels protect those who love and trust the Lord – *Psalm 91:11-13; Hebrews 1:6-7*
3. We must not presume upon our God as Satan may tempt us – *Matthew 4:5-7*

III. Communion With God – *Psalm 91:14-16*

- A. God Himself is speaking to those who hope in Him
1. The Father answers prayers for deliverance – *Psalm 50:15*
 2. The Lord is with us – *Isaiah 43:1-2*
- B. Long life in this and life in God's presence eternally
