“Salvation is from the Lord”

Jonah 2:7-10

Because the Lord God is the Creator and Sustainer of this world, and everything in it, He alone is the objective point of reference for all things. That includes you and me. There can be no navigation without a point of reference. Practically, this means I am either actively acknowledging God's sovereign rule over all creation as well as my own life, or I am submitting to the rule and reign of myself. The Lord's salvation is “from Him and through Him and to Him” (Romans 11:36), for the glory of His name and for the joy of His people.

After these things I heard something like a loud voice of a great multitude in heaven, saying,

“Hallelujah! Salvation and glory and power belong to our God.”

-Revelation 19:1

Weekly Bible Study Guide -Jonah

1. Jonah remembered the Lord while he was “fainting away” (2:7). He faced the Lord (2:1-2) after having run from the Lord’s presence (1:3). Do you wait until things go badly before you call out to the Lord? Why? What can you do to change that? Who can help?
2. Jonah’s prayer considered the futility of worshipping idols (2:8). But each one of us struggles with idols of the heart. How do you view people around you in obvious sin? How do you see your own sin even as you hate their sin?
3. Jonah’s prayer ends with a vow (2:9). What vows have you taken? How well have you kept them? Consider the promises the Lord has made for the sake of His elect and ask the Lord to apply them to your life.
4. “Salvation is of the Lord” (2:9), completely and fully a gift from God (Ephesians 2:8-10). At the same time, it is possible to neglect this great gift (Hebrews 2:3). In what ways do you treat your salvation as exclusively your own and not the Lord’s? What evidence do you see in your life that are you growing in grace?
5. Just like Jonah, events and experiences happen in our lives that don't meet our expectations. Honesty before the Lord, and taking hold of His promises, is critical to progress. What life experiences are motivating you to wonder if God cares about you? Take time today to examine these events in light of the Word of God.
6. How is your heavenly citizenship (1:9) influencing your daily outlook and actions?
7. The Word of the Lord has come to you this day. How will you respond?
