“Revival”
Luke 5:1-11

“Will You not revive us again that your people may rejoice in You?” (Psalm 85:6). What are we praying for when we ask God to send a revival to our church, community, nation, and world? A revival is not just stirring up interest in the local church or religion in general. Revivals cannot be organized or controlled by any people. God alone sends revival. Almighty God humbles His people and motivates intensive love and obedience to Him. For example, Pentecost when the Holy Spirit was poured out brought terror on those who crucified Jesus (Acts 2:36-39), and faith in Christ (Acts 2:40-47). Such an event took place in the American colonies from 1739-1741. God powerfully used the preaching of George Whitefield, Jonathan Edwards, Gilbert Tennent, and Samuel Davies to convict and cleanse hundreds and thousands of colonists. This was the first national event in the colonies leading to the American Declaration of Independence in 1776.

I. Complacency – Luke 5:1-5

- A. The belief that the Lord will not do good, nor will He do evil –
Zephaniah 1:12
 - 1. What is the response of the multitude to Jesus’ teaching? Seeming complacency.
 - 2. The Fredericksburg region did not experience the Great Awakening in 1741
 - 3. George Whitefield was not allowed to preach in the area because the townspeople were given to drinking, gaming, and horse racing
 - 4. Young people were committed to financial success. Religion was viewed for the old

- B. Whitefield shook the dust off his feet and left Fredericksburg –
Matthew 10:14-15
 - 1. Was the Battle of Fredericksburg during the Civil War in December 1862 related to this act of Whitefield’s? *Ezekiel 39:11-16*
 - 2. Fredericksburg has consistently been a prosperous city
 - 3. Has its prosperity been a barrier to seeking God? – *Luke 5:5* – With limited gospel response?

II. The Word Brings Revival – Luke 5:5-7

- A. “At Your Word, I will let down the net”
 - 1. The same God who spoke light into existence, alone saves sinners –
2 Corinthians 4:5-6
 - 2. Broken sinners are healed by Christ alone – *John 1:12-13; 3:6-8*
Every person must be born of God.
 - 3. Rend your heart, and He will heal us – *Joel 2:12-14; Hosea 6:1-3*

- B. God sent revival blesses all true gospel churches – *Luke 5:6-7*
 - 1. Christ is building His Kingdom
 - 2. Not merely one church or one man’s kingdom

III. **Humbled** – Luke 5:8-11

A. “Depart from me for I am a sinful man” – Luke 5:8

1. Isaiah saw the holiness of the Lord on His throne and repented – *Isaiah 6:1-7*
2. Revival prophesied – *Zechariah 12:10-11; 13:1*
3. God dwells with the humbled – *Isaiah 57:15*

In revival, the redeemed see the holiness of God and His Lordship over all the earth.

B. The Lord commissions those He reveals Himself to – *Luke 5:10-11*

1. Isaiah also sent to serve – *Isaiah 6:8-10*
2. Such going is costly – *Matthew 19:27-29*

**Revival is sent by God to see His glory, His Lordship,
and to respond to evangelize.**
